Statistics (Class of 2020)

More than \$11,713,829 was offered in college scholarships. In recent years, 98.75% of our graduates continued formal education:

- 80.5% enroll in a four-year college/university
- 18.5% enroll in a two-year college
- 1% serve our military or enter into the workforce

Guidance — *continued*

The CJ Guidance Department will assist your son or daughter with a wide range of issues, including academics, career exploration, personal problems, and college admission. This schedule may help you understand the different services we offer to our students during their four years at CJ. For each grade, a Whole Grade Review is conducted prior to the end of the first semester.

Freshman Year

- August: General homeroom meeting: introductions
- October: PSAT for 9th grade
- November: Meet each 9th grader by Thanksgiving
- December/January: Assistance with scheduling for 10th grade
- March/April: State of Ohio testing
- Ongoing: Assist students with personal, academic, or social issues as needed

Sophomore Year

- September: Homeroom meeting: Career Exploration
- October: PreACT administered to all sophomores
- December/January: Assistance with scheduling for 11th grade
- March/April: State of Ohio testing
- Ongoing: Assist students with personal, academic, or social issues as needed

Junior Year

- September: Distribution of PSAT booklets/ working in Math and English classes
- October: PSAT will be administered to all juniors
- December/January: Assistance with scheduling for 12th grade
- February: Planning for the college selection process with English classes
- March: ACT testing
- March/April: State of Ohio testing
- Spring: Take the SAT and ACT (both) before senior year
Tests may be taken before this time and as many times as the student/parent see fit.
Athletes may want to start taking the test as early as freshman year to become familiar with the test and to reach the desired score for NCAA regulations
- Ongoing: Assist students with personal, academic, or social issues as needed

Senior Year

- September: Parent and class meeting to review college application process, college visit — including a school-sponsored field trip option, financial aid, scholarships
- Fall: Take SAT and/or ACT if necessary; SAT II if required by college of interest
- October: Apply to college
- November: Submit college application by November 1
- October-January: File Financial Aid forms and CSS profile, if required by college
- March/April: State of Ohio testing
- May: Finalize college decision by May 1st deadline
- December: Apply for scholarships and financial aid
- Ongoing: Individual meetings with seniors regarding post-high school plans upon request
