What is College Credit Plus?

The opportunity for high school students who are college-ready to earn high school and college credit simultaneously while still in high school.



CCP Details

- College courses are free to students
- Courses will count for credit on both high school and college transcripts
- College course will be weighted as Honors course in same subject area
- Open to students in grades 7-12



CCP Details (cont'd)

- All Ohio public colleges/universities participate
- Students must be college-ready and apply and be accepted to a college
- Students must take a placement test or have high enough ACT/SAT
- CCP is available for summer term



CCP Student Feedback

“I just had to email you guys again because I have the greatest news of all time. So I just went in to meet with my academic advisor here at Xavier to switch my major from Middle Childhood Education to Early Childhood Education. This lady told me I HAVE 12 WHOLE CREDITS from Wright State which means I'm almost an ENTIRE semester ahead of everyone! But it gets better. CCP Options

1. Take courses on the college campus
2. Take courses online through the college
3. Take courses approved by the college at CJ taught by CJ teachers



Sinclair CCP Courses at CJ

1. AP Psychology
 - PSY 1100 (3 sem hours)
2. EDD
 - MET 1281 (2 sem hours)
3. AP Biology
 - BIO 1111 & 1211(8 sem hours)
4. AP US History
 - HIS 1101 & 1102 (6 sem hours)



WSU CCP Courses at CJ

1. Eng 12: Global Issues
 - ENG 1100 & 2040 (6 sem hours)
2. For. Lang. level 3 (3 sem hrs each)
 - SPN 2010 and FR 2010
3. For. Lang. level 4 (3 sem hrs each)
 - SPN 2020 and FR 2020



Risks of CCP

- Students must follow college's rules
- Students must follow college's policies on withdrawing/dropping
- Grade earned is permanent on high school and college transcript
- Taking CCP classes could affect future scholarship opportunities



Risks of CCP (cont'd)

- Doing poorly in a CCP class can have financial aid implications in the future
- Conflicts with high school schedule (especially summer term)
- Extra-curricular activity conflicts and eligibility implications
- If student fails or withdraws from course, student will be charged cost of tuition



AP or CCP?

- To earn college credit through AP, students must take AP test in May
- CCP might not transfer to out-of-state or private colleges/universities

How to Participate

1. Discuss your plans with your Guidance Counselor
2. Submit your letter of intent to participate to ODE by April 1, 2019
3. Apply for admission to the college
4. Parents must establish a SAFE account and apply for funding



How to Participate (cont'd)

5. Apply for state funding Feb. 15 - April 12* (will be awarded before May 17)

*College admission letter(s) must be uploaded to SAFE account before funding application can be submitted

*Be sure to request funding for *credit hours*, not courses

*If a student is not funded then the student will have to drop the course(s) or self-pay

Important Dates

Before March 31: Discuss CCP plans with counselor

Feb. 15 - April 1: Submit [Letter of Intent](#)

Feb. 15 - April 12: Sign-up for a [SAFE Account](#)

Feb. 15 - April 12: Apply for funding*

Before May 17: Funding award notifications sent

*College acceptance letter(s) must be submitted with funding request so apply and take placement tests ASAP



CCP at WSU

1. Apply [online](#) to WSU by May 1
2. Request your CJ transcript be sent to WSU
3. Determine placement by ACT or SAT results or WSU's placement test. Must be completed by May 1.
4. Register for courses
5. WSU must receive your funding confirmation by July 1

CCP at Sinclair

1. Apply [online](#) by May 1
2. Submit [CCP Authorization Form](#)
3. Wait for acceptance letter from Sinclair. It will contain the steps for completing the orientation and registration process



CCP at Sinclair (cont'd)

3. Determine placement by appropriate high school course work, ACT or SAT results, or Sinclair's placement test.
4. Provide Sinclair a copy of your funding confirmation

Current CCP Students

- Must complete letter of intent and apply for funding
- Do not need to reapply with college if student took classes with that college already
- Will need to apply to college if student never took classes there



Miscellaneous

- Funding shortage and self-pay
- Transferring credits
 - For high school credit, college will send grade directly to CJ
 - For future college credit, student must request transcript from the college the summer after senior year
